## Accreditation 2017-18

### Rolla Public School District - Accredited with Distinction in Performance

All Missouri school districts are required to participate in an accreditation process that is referred to as Missouri School Improvement Program (MSIP). The current process is referred to MSIP5. Currently MSIP6 is in development with the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE). Currently, the Rolla Public School District is accredited and has performed very well on the Annual Performance Report (APR) because of the high performance level of the students. Because of the high performance of the students, the District qualifies for a waiver of the accrediting team visit by the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education.

The MSIP accrediting processes include measures of sets of Resource Standards, Process Standards and Performance Standards. Examples of the Resource Standards include safe and functional facilities, professional certifications for staff members, and appropriate instructional materials and equipment. The Process Standards require specifically written curriculum and instruction, differentiated instruction, good instructional climate, appropriate library media centers, guidance and counseling programs, governance and administration requirements, food service and transportation programs. The Performance Standards include academic achievement measures, advanced courses, career education courses, college and career education placement measures, high graduation rates, strong student attendance, and equitable performance levels by minority groups.
